About This Trip •

The Thamsar Pass Trek is one of Himachal Pradesh's lesser-known but incredibly rewarding high-altitude treks. Nestled in the Dhauladhar range of the Himalayas, this trek provides an ideal mix of stunning natural scenery, cultural experiences, and adventurous challenges, making it perfect for seasoned trekkers looking for offbeat routes.

- Altitude: ~4,800 meters (15,748 feet)
- Duration: 5–6 days

Trail Highlights

1. Scenic Villages & Meadows

The trail passes through remote Himalayan hamlets like Rajgundha, Plachhak, and Panahartu, giving you a glimpse into the simple and resilient mountain life. Verdant meadows, shepherd trails, and rhododendron forests add to the scenic charm.

2. Johdi Waterfall

One of the most picturesque pitstops on the trail is Johdi Waterfall, a serene spot surrounded by dense greenery perfect for a mid-trek breather.

3. Thamsar Pass Summit

The ultimate goal of the trek, Thamsar Pass, sits at a staggering 4,800 meters and offers panoramic views of the Dhauladhar and Pir Panjal ranges. The climb to the summit is demanding, with glacial moraines, rocky terrain, and icy winds, but the views from the top make it all worthwhile.

Cultural & Natural Richness

Unlike the more commercialised treks, Thamsar Pass retains its raw charm. You'll interact with local Gaddi shepherds, trek past ancient monasteries, and witness landscapes that shift dramatically—from dense pine forests to snowy ridges.

Trek Difficulty

The trek is moderate to difficult, primarily due to its high altitude and remote location. It's best suited for trekkers with previous experience at elevations above 3,000 meters. Physical fitness and proper acclimatisation are essential.

Logistics & Starting Point

- **Base Camp:** Usually begins from Rajgundha or Barot (both accessible from Bir or Joginder Nagar).
- **Nearest Towns:** Bir, Joginder Nagar
- **Transport:** Shared jeeps or private taxis can take you from Bir to the starting point.
- **Guides & Permits:** Hiring a local guide is recommended due to the challenging terrain and unpredictable weather.
