About This Trip •

This unforgettable 13-day Zanskar Package begins in Delhi with an overnight journey to Manali, traversing scenic valleys and winding mountain roads. From Manali, the adventure leads to Jispa via the iconic Atal Tunnel and the tranquil village of Sissu, gradually introducing travellers to the higher altitudes of the Himalayas.

On Day 3, the journey continues over the dramatic Shinku La Pass, reaching an elevation of 16,580 feet, with breathtaking views of the majestic Gonbo Rangjon peak before arriving at Purne. The following day is highlighted by a trek to the remote Phugtal Monastery, a spectacular cave monastery carved into the cliffs of Zanskar.

Day 5 takes you to Padum, with visits to serene Shila Waterfall, Karsha Gompa, and Stongde Monastery, immersing you in Zanskar's rich cultural heritage. From Padum, the route winds through high-altitude passes, the Drang Drung Glacier, and Rangdum Monastery before reaching Kargil.

The journey to Leh includes stops at Drass, Mulbekh, Lamayuru, and the scenic Fotu La Pass. From Leh, the route ascends to Khardung La, then descends to Nubra Valley, where travellers can experience Hunder's dunes and monasteries. The adventure continues to Pangong Tso, with its ever-changing blue waters, and onward to the peaceful village of Hanle, home to one of the world's highest observatories.

A day trip to Umling La, the world's highest motorable pass at 19,000 feet, marks the journey's pinnacle. The route then leads to Tso Moriri, passing serene lakes and remote passes, before heading back to Jispa and eventually returning to Manali and Delhi.

This journey offers an extraordinary blend of adventure, natural beauty, and spiritual discovery in the remote corners of Ladakh and Zaskar.

Itinerary •

Day 1: Delhi to Manali | Dist: 501 km | Time: 12 to 13 hr | Altitude: 230 to 2050 m

- Your journey will commence from Delhi at night, either by Volvo bus or cab.
- After a scenic 12 to 13-hour drive through the beautiful valleys of Himachal Pradesh, you'll reach Manali the following day.

Meals: Nil

Night: Overnight Journey by AC Volvo Bus

Day 2: Stay in Manali

- Upon arriving in Manali, you'll check into your hotel.
- Today we will stay in Manali for acclimatisation before leaving for Purne.
- Later in the afternoon, a cab will take you to visit popular attractions, including Mall Road, Hadimba Temple, Van Vihar, Old Manali, the Museum, and the Clubhouse.

Night: Stay at the hotel in Manali

Day 3: Manali to Purne via Shinku La pass | Dist: 275 km | Time: 07 to 08 hr | Altitude: 2050 to 4029 m

- Today, we depart from Jispa and journey toward Purne, traversing the high-altitude Shinku La Pass, which rises to an impressive 5,160 meters (16,580 feet).
- En route, the awe-inspiring peak of Gonbo Rangjon reveals its towering, pyramid-like form, standing like a silent guardian, ushering us into the remote and mystical valleys that lie ahead.

Night: Stay at the hotel in Purne

Day 4: Trek to Phugtal Monastery and Depart to Padum | Dist: 56 km | Time: 01 to 03 hr |

Altitude: 3810 to 3850 m

- We begin our day early with a trek to the ancient Phugtal Monastery, a breathtaking structure dramatically perched on a cliffside deep in the heart of Zaskar.
- This journey is more than a physical trek; it's a spiritual passage through rugged terrain and along the banks of a winding river, offering a glimpse into the profound tranquillity of one of the most remote monasteries in the Himalayas.
- The 1.5-hour hike takes us through narrow mountain paths and rocky outcrops, tracing the river's serpentine course.
- As we round a final bend, the monastery suddenly comes into view, clinging to the cliffs as though carved from the mountain itself.
- Built within a massive natural cave, Phugtal Monastery is both a spiritual sanctuary and an architectural wonder, seamlessly blending into its dramatic surroundings
- Later, we will leave for Padum and visit the serene Shila Waterfall.
- In the afternoon, we delve into the region's rich spiritual heritage by exploring the ancient monasteries around Padum.
- Our first stop is Karsha Gompa, the largest monastery in Zaskar, known for its stunning hilltop location and historic murals.
- From there, we continue to Stongde Monastery, perched dramatically on a hilltop with sweeping views of the valley below, a true photographer's delight.
- As evening falls, take time to stroll through the charming Padum market.

Night: Stay at the hotel in Padum

Day 5: Padum to Kargil | Dist: 228km | Time: 08 to 09hr | Altitude: 3669 to 2676m

- Today, we travel along the scenic Padum–Kargil road, passing some of Zaskar's most iconic sights.
- Just outside Padum lies Sani Lake, home to a sacred statue of Guru Padmasambhava. Further ahead, we encounter the mighty Drang-Drung Glacier, stretching over 23 km, an unforgettable sight.
- We then reach Pensi La Pass, the gateway to Zaskar, adorned with the stunning Lang Tso and Stat Tso twin lakes.
- We then proceed to the historic Rangdum Monastery, a remote and peaceful site steeped in centuries of spiritual practice.
- After reaching Kargil, you will check into the hotel and relax.

Night: Stay at the hotel in Kargil

Day 6: Kargil to Leh | Dist: 200 km | Time: 06 to 07hr | Altitude: 2676 m to 3527 m

- After an early breakfast, you'll visit Drass, one of the coldest inhabited places on Earth and the Kargil war memorial.
- On the journey to Leh, you'll explore several cultural and scenic highlights, including Mulbekh, known for its ancient rock-carved Buddha, Lamayuru, home to one of Ladakh's oldest monasteries, and Fotu La Pass.
- By evening, you'll arrive back in Leh and check into your hotel for some well-deserved rest.

Meals: Breakfast and Dinner

Night: Stay at the hotel in Leh

Day 7: Leh Sightseeing

- Enjoy breakfast and set out for a full-day local tour.
- Visit the Hall of Fame, Spituk Monastery, Gurudwara Patthar Sahib, Magnetic Hill, Sangam (Indus-Zaskar Confluence), and the Rafting Point.
- Return to the hotel by evening.

Night: Stay at the hotel in Leh

Day 8: Leh to Nubra Valley via Khardung La | Dist: 160 km | Time: 04 to 05hr | Altitude: 3527 m to 3050 m

- Today, drive to Nubra Valley crossing the famous Khardung La Pass, one of the world's

highest motorable roads.

- Explore the Hunder sand dunes and enjoy a double-humped camel ride. Visit Hunder Village, Diskit Village, and the Diskit Monastery, known for its giant Buddha statue overlooking the valley.
- In the evening, check into your stay in Hunder.

Meals: Breakfast and Dinner

Night: Stay at the hotel/camps in Hunder

Day 9: Excursion to Turtuk | Dist: 80 km | Time: 03 to 04hr | Altitude: 3527 m to 3001 m

- Post breakfast, embark on an excursion to Turtuk (approx. 85 km).
- Surrounded by apricot orchards, waterfalls, and stunning views of K-2 peak, this Balti village offers a unique cultural experience.
- Spend the day exploring before returning to Nubra in the evening.

Meals: Breakfast & Dinner

Night: Stay at the camps in Hunder

Day 10: Nubra Valley to Pangong Tso | Dist: 274 km | Time: 06 to 07 hr | Altitude: 3050 m to 4225 m

- Start the day with peaceful views of the Karakoram Mountains. After breakfast, proceed towards the spectacular Pangong Tso, famous for its shifting blue hues and dramatic setting.
- The route takes you through Shayok Village, Durbuk, and Tangtse, offering glimpses of Ladakh's remote charm.
- Arrive at Pangong Lake and settle into your lakeside cottage or camp.

Meals: Breakfast and Dinner

Night: Stay at the hotel in Pangong

Day 11: Pangong to Hanle via Tsaka La Pass | Dist: 165 km | Time: 05 to 06 hr | Altitude: 4225 m to 4500 m

- After breakfast, drive to Hanle, a remote village known for its tranquil atmosphere and clear skies.
- Cross the scenic Tsaka La Pass, then visit the Hanle Monastery, a centuries-old gompa offering panoramic valley views.
- In the evening, visit the Hanle Observatory, one of the highest in the world, for an unforgettable stargazing experience.

Meals: Breakfast and Dinner

Night: Stay at the hotel in Hanle

Day 12: Umlingla Pass - Hanle to Tso Moriri | Dist: 160 km | Time 04 to 05 hr | Altitude: 4500 m to 4595 m

- Today, embark on a day trip to Umling La Pass, the world's highest motorable pass at over 19,000 feet.
- Located near Demchok, Umling La offers stunning views of remote valleys and high-altitude landscapes.
- After soaking in the views, we will leave for Tso Moriri Lake.

Meals: Breakfast and Dinner

Night: Stay at the hotel in Tso Moriri Lake

Day 13: Tso Moriri Lake to Manali | Dist: 374 km | Time 07 to 08 hr | Altitude: 4595 m to 2050 m

- After breakfast, Ride through Polo Kongka La (4,940 m) and Namashang La (4,800 m)
- Stop at Tso Kar Lake and cross Lachung La (5,059 m) & Nakee La (4,739 m)
- Drive via Gata Loops (21 hairpin bends).
- After reaching Manali, you will leave for Delhi in an AC Volvo Bus.

Q: What is the Zaskar Package?

A: The Zaskar Package is an adventure tour that explores the remote Zaskar Valley in Ladakh, known for its rugged terrain, monasteries, high passes, and the Zaskar River. It often includes trekking, overland journeys, and river rafting.

Q: What does the Leh Ladakh Zaskar Expedition cover?

A: This expedition typically begins in Leh, traverses Ladakh's high-altitude deserts, and ventures deep into the Zaskar Valley, covering destinations such as Kargil, Padum, Pensi La, and various ancient monasteries.

Q: What is a typical Zaskar Expedition itinerary?

A: A standard itinerary lasts 8–14 days and please check the above itinerary.

Q: What types of Zaskar packages are available?

A: Group tours Overland jeep expeditions Trekking expeditions Rafting tours Photography & cultural tours

Q: What is included in a typical Zaskar tour package?

A: Transport (4x4 vehicles or tempo traveler) Accommodation (hotels, guesthouses, camping), Meals Permits Guide and support staff

Q: What is the Spiti-Zaskar route?

A: This adventurous circuit links Spiti Valley (Himachal Pradesh) to Zaskar, often via Shinku La or Phuktal. It includes spectacular terrain but requires a robust vehicle and good acclimatisation.

Q: Are group tour packages available for Zaskar Valley?

A: Yes, several travel companies offer fixed-departure group tours, especially during the summer (June–September).

Q: How can I travel from Chandigarh to Zanskar?

A: By road: Chandigarh - Manali - Keylong - Shinku La - Padum (Zanskar) Or via Srinagar - Kargil - Pensi La - Padum By air: Chandigarh - Leh (by flight), then travel by road to Zanskar

Q: What is the Zanskar Valley Expedition?

A: This is a broader term for trips involving overland travel, cultural exploration, and trekking through Zanskar Valley, including remote villages and high-altitude passes.

Q: What is the Zanskar Leh Expedition?

A: A tour starting from Leh that ventures into Zanskar Valley, often completing a loop via Kargil or Darcha (Himachal Pradesh), depending on the route.

Q: What is the Zanskar Rafting Expedition?

A: This is a multi-day white-water rafting trip on the Zanskar River, navigating Class III–IV rapids through steep gorges, typically from Remala to Nimu.

Q: Is the Zanskar River rafting expedition safe?

A: Yes, if done with experienced operators. It requires: Good physical fitness Ability to handle cold water and altitude Participation in safety drills

Q: What are the main passes in the Zanskar Range?

A: Pensi La (4,400 m) – Gateway to Zanskar from Kargil Shinku La (5,091 m) – Connects Zanskar with Himachal (Manali side) Umasi La and Phirtse La – Popular trekking passes

Q: How to reach Zanskar Valley from Leh?

A: Route 1: Leh - Kargil - Rangdum - Pensi La - Padum Route 2 (if open): Leh - Upshi - Tsomoriri - Sarchu - Darcha - Shinku La - Padum

Q: What is the distance from Leh to the Zanskar River?

A: The Zanskar River confluence (at Nimu) is about 35 km from Leh. To reach Padum (Zanskar's main town), it's around 450 km via Kargil and Pensi La.

Q: What is the Zanskar Valley Trek?

A: The Zanskar Valley Trek is a high-altitude adventure route through remote Himalayan terrain. Popular treks include: Lamayuru to Padum Trek Phuktal Monastery Trek Zanskar Chadar Trek (winter only – on frozen river) Darcha to Padum Trek via Shinku La

Q: What does a Zanskar Valley trip include?

A: A typical trip includes: Overland journey from Leh or Manali Visits to key villages and monasteries Optional activities like rafting or short treks Cultural immersion in Tibetan-Buddhist traditions

Q: How far is Zanskar Valley from Leh?

A: Leh to Padum (Zanskar's main town): ~450 km Takes 2 days by road via Kargil, Suru Valley, and Pensi La Roads open from June to early October

Q: What does a Zaskar Valley tour involve?

A: It typically includes: Road trip from Leh or Manali Visits to Phuktal, Karsha, Zangla, and Stongdey Monasteries Cultural interactions in villages like Padum, Sani, Rangdum Scenic drives through Pensi La, Suru Valley, Drang Drung Glacier

Q: What are the top places to visit in Zaskar Valley?

A: Phuktal Monastery (built into a cave) Karsha Monastery (the largest in Zaskar) Stongdey and Zangla Monasteries Drang Drung Glacier (near Pensi La)

Q: What are the top places to visit in Zaskar Valley?

A: Phuktal, Karsha, Stongdey, Sani Monastery monastery, Gonbo Rangjon and more
